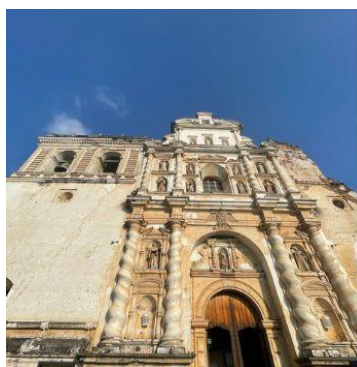

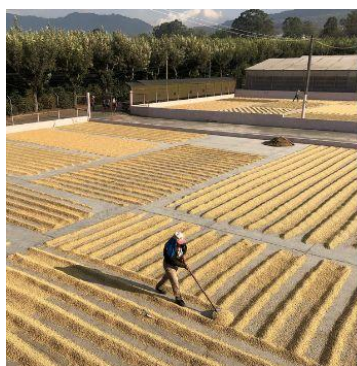
Day 7 – Sunrise at top of pyramid & Tikal – overnight Boluntiku

**Day 1– Meet and Greet at Airport - Transfer to Antigua & Welcome Mayan Ceremony** – a driver will meet you at the airport and transfer you to Antigua. – **Overnight at Villa Bokeh.**



**Day 2 – Antigua Historic Walking Tour & Natural Dyes Workshop with Luna Zorro** – Antigua is known for its distinctive characteristics of Colonial architectural style which includes the use of decorative stucco for interior and exterior ornamentation, main facades with a central window niche and often a deeply-carved tympanum, massive buildings, and low bell towers. Visit the Palace of the Captains General, the Cathedral, San Francisco Monastery, La Merced, the arch of Santa Catalina, among others. **Luna Zorro Plant Based Dyes:** Workshop held at beautiful coffee haciendas gardens. Where you will walk through the step by step process of dyeing, fixing, and drying. Each student will get to choose which color they will dye their towel and scrunchie. Time after the workshop will be available for browsing the Luna Zorro studio space and gardens. – **Overnight Villa Bokeh.**



**Day 3 – Coffee Tour & Special dinner at Heritage Building/Private Home - Coffee Tour** – Visit a real working coffee hacienda located on the outskirts of Antigua. Here you will learn about the history and production of



coffee in Guatemala. Historical German migration, the beans' harvesting by hand, and coffee's artisanal processing are just some of the things you will learn about. – **Overnight Villa Bokeh.**



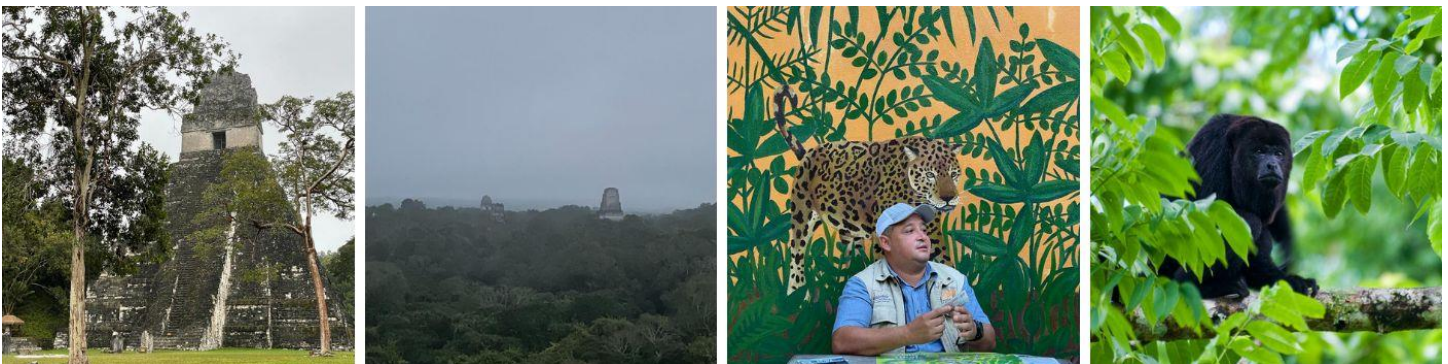
**Day 4 – Helicopter Transfer Lake Atitlan – Time at Leisure & Sunset Drinks Lake Atitlan** – Lake Atitlan is recognized as one of the most beautiful lakes in the world. This reputation is in large part thanks to the breathtaking views of the three lakeside volcanoes: Atitlán (3537m), Tolimán (3158m), and San Pedro (3020m), which were formed by volcanic activity millions of years ago. Today there are several indigenous villages on its shores, with locals dressed in traditional multicolored outfits, fertile hills dotting the landscape, and a mystical beauty. – **Overnight Casa Palopo.**



**Day 5 – Lake Atitlan - Weaving & Textile Experience - Lake Atitlan** – Lake Atitlan is recognized as one of the most beautiful lakes in the world. This reputation is in large part thanks to the breathtaking views of the three lakeside volcanoes: Atitlán (3537m), Tolimán (3158m), and San Pedro (3020m), which were formed by volcanic activity millions of years ago. Today there are several indigenous villages on its shores, with weavers and traditional multicolored outfits. We will visit a cooperative of weavers to get to know the art and ancestral technique. – **Overnight Casa Palopo**



**Day 6 – Helicopter transfer to Chichicastenango Market & Guatemala City for Flight to Peten - Chichicastenango** – Once called Chaviar and abbreviated as ‘Chichi’, this village was once an important Kaqchiquel trading post before the Spanish conquest. It seems isolated, but today Chichicastenango is filled to the brim every Thursday and Sunday with crowds of vendors and buyers converging for market day. At the market’s center, the church of Santo Tomás was built over a Mayan temple, and today is one of the most fascinating places to observe the convergence of Mayan and Christian beliefs. – **Overnight Jungle Lodge in Peten**



**Day 7 – Sunrise at top of pyramid & Tikal - Tikal** – The National Park of Tikal, a 222 square mile UNESCO World Heritage Site, is the region’s most significant Maya ruins. Guarded by dense jungle, this archaeological site contains thousands of structures, of which only 10% have been excavated. Six majestic temples help visitors understand the history and fascination of the grand civilization that thrived here from 300 to 900 AD. – **Overnight Boluntiku.**

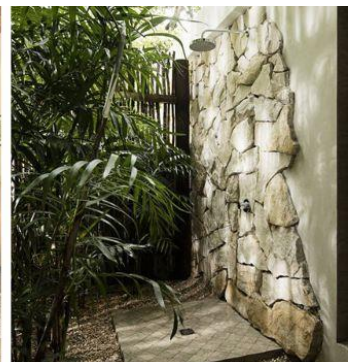
